

Am I eligible for a waiver?

Waivers are available for households whose sole income is from social welfare, or where the household income falls below the income tax threshold. Hardship cases are assessed on an individual basis.

Ringsend Recycling Centre This recycling centre accepts a wide range of material that cannot be included in household waste collections or at other bring centres and bring banks.

All of the following non-hazardous items are accepted:

Aluminium trays, Books, Cans, Cardboard, CDs/DVDs, Clothes, Furniture, Glass, Household construction/demolition waste, Newspapers, Paper, Plastic bottles, Plastic Packaging, Stamps, Tetra-Pak, Textiles and Videos.

The following hazardous items are also accepted: Car batteries, Computer equipment, Cooking oil, Engine oil, Fluorescent tubes, Freezers, Fridges, Gas cylinders, Household batteries, Light bulbs, Medicines, Mobile phones, Paints, Print cartridges, Scrap metal, Tumble dryers, Washing machines, Weed killers.

Charges apply to certain vehicles and categories of waste.
